

# Peel Vulnerable Persons Registry Program

## What is it?

Peel Regional Police have a Vulnerable Persons' Registry (VPR) that helps police and the community locate missing people or individuals who may be in danger. The registry allows the caregivers of vulnerable people to submit information that can be used by emergency services during a crisis situation (e.g. person is missing, etc).

## Who Can Register?

This program includes individuals with an inability to communicate because of illness/condition, this would include aphasia.

## How to Register?

You can register online at:

The following information is required:

- Name.
- Date of birth.
- Physical descriptors (e.g. scars, birthmarks etc.).
- Contact information.
- Special needs.
- Methods of approach if found.
- A photo of the person's face (JPEG format).

Your information will only be used by police personnel for the purposes of this program.

# Halton Vulnerable Person Registry

## What is it?

The Vulnerable Person Registry is a voluntary service offered throughout the Halton Region which provides the Halton Regional Police Service to access your critical information during an emergency situation.

## Who Can Register?

A Vulnerable Person is defined as a person who due to a medical, mental health or physical condition. This includes individuals with an inability to communicate.

## How to Register?

The following information is required:

- Name
- Address
- Contact information
- Medical condition
- De-Escalation techniques
- Tendencies/Routines
- Recent photograph of the individual (optional)

Your information will only be used by police personnel for the purposes of this program.
